MEMBER PROFILE

Joan Horwich
Interview with Sheri Gittinger

Sheri began weaving in 2014. She had always wanted to weave and met some weavers at Lake Farmpark who were demonstrating for the Western Reserve Spinners and Weavers guild. She picked up a brochure. After Sheri stopped working, it seemed like a good time to pursue weaving. She joined the Western Reserve guild in 2013, but didn't actually began to weave until she rented a 4 shaft Dorothy table loom in 2014. Sheri then joined the Cuyahoga weavers guild in 2015. She can't remember how she learned about the guild, but was happy to find a weaving group that met during the day.

Sheri purchased her first loom, a Glimakra 4-shaft countermarch loom in 2015. She then added to her collection by buying a 4-shaft baby wolf which traveled with her to workshops. Sheri eventually upgraded her Glimakra to 8 shafts in 2021 She then sold her BW 4-shaft and purchased an 8 shaft baby-wolf this past spring, and a 16 shaft Ashford table loom this fall. In addition to her floor looms, Sheri owns a rigid heddle loom, an inkle loom and a pin loom.

Sheri's favorite weave structure in overshot, but she is not one to stay with only one thing. She is interested in dyeing and iridescence and would like to learn more about designing. She would also like to start using her weaving to create yardage and sew garments.

In addition to weaving, Sheri spins, dyes and sews. She was an avid quilter for about 20 years.
